Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation is a memorial charity foundation, which founded in 2005 after the tragic death of Yerzhan Tatishev, who was the Chairman of the Board of TuranAlem Bank. Since the Foundation has been engaged in various non-commercial projects, including humanitarian assistance programs, grants for NGOs, craft development centers, lectures for specialists and students with the participation of foreign experts, and others. The examination obtained over the years has made it possible to determine what is most valuable - This is an investment in a growing generation, its education, and upbringing. In 2007, the Foundation launched its first programs, over time, some were transformed, others deepened, and still, others were completely abolished. During the existence of the Foundation, were established 100 scholarships and 126 grants to the best universities and colleges of Kazakhstan, 75 of them received bachelor's degrees in finance and economics and diplomas of college in the field of medicine, law, IT technology, sports, philology, and education. The Foundation's educational grants are not just financial support, they are a way that broadens the horizons, opens the world in a new way, introduces oneself to oneself, makes one believe in the best and inspires one to do things. Each year, a new generation of leaders become part of the Foundation 's community, taking on the baton of values from those who are already at the finish line.

"BesTirek" Program

"BesTirek" program is one of the Foundation's most ambitious projects, which previously existed under the name Educational Grants Program for graduates of schools, colleges, and orphanages. The Foundation provided grants for obtaining degrees in financial and economic specialties and collaborated with various universities. A total of 79 grants were awarded for graduates of schools, colleges, and inmates of orphanages, 42 of them received bachelor's degrees. Among the partners of the Foundation: AlmaU, KIMEP University, SDU, UMB, KBTU, KazNTU named after K. Satpayev, KazNU named after Al Farabi. In 2019, the Foundation honored its graduates: Kalibekov Darkhan (SDU), Magzomova Aruzhan (AlmaU), Tokhtakhmetova Madina (SDU).

From year to year, the Foundation cultivates good specialists, who subsequently successfully find jobs in large international companies. Of course, this positively affects the quality of their life but did not give an increase in economically proactive units that would contribute to the country's economy. So in 2017, the program was modernized and rebranded. The name "BesTirek" is consonant with the phrase "best trek" (best way) and gives five pillars: the potential of the scholarship holder, grant support for the Foundation, education received at the university, support for mentors and the Summer Entrepreneurship School at Babson College, USA. The uniqueness of "BesTirek" is that an additional module, "entrepreneurship" / minor, is built into the main/major training program. The student develops entrepreneurial thinking and gets the opportunity to create his own business before graduating from the university, which saves his time resources and gives a chance to find his niche in business and in life.

Almaty Management University (AlmaU), now, is the only partner of the Program. The University has the Center for the Development of Entrepreneurship and Innovation (CRI), which provides full support for the design activities of minor students, starting from the origin of the idea and ending with a full-fledged business concept. Students participate in events with the participation of entrepreneurs and learn about the intricacies of doing business, the rules of the game in a business environment, increase financial literacy, and most importantly, are inspired by their example. The Program also provides for internal competition, the authors of the best business ideas get the opportunity to participate in the summer camp at Babson College (USA). With the successful launch of the startup, the Foundation provides an additional grant for its development. In 2019, Batyrbekova Zhayna (Nur-Sultan), Duisenkhan Medet (Almaty), Ismailov Kenzhebek (Saryagash), Mutalkhan Rakhat (Taraz), Sharip Danya (Petropavlovsk) received Foundation grants. Each of them has experience in implementing small startups, promoting goods and services, which will undoubtedly help them in creating strong and interesting business projects.

The second-largest program is the Get Metier Program. The target group of this program is children with disabilities, many of whom are graduates of special schools. Recruitment for the Program is held annually on a competitive basis, the winners get a chance to study according to their wishes and the possibilities of the profession in any college in Kazakhstan. Although the program is charitable and the grantees' material status is taken into account when distributing grants, the Foundation prefers purposeful children with an active life position and mature vision of their future who are able to set goals and demonstrate a good level of intellectual and emotional development. Under the Program, 47 young people received grants, of which 33 became graduates. In 2019, Zhumagulova Zhanerke, Seytbek Asel and Terekhova Maria received diplomas from Turan College, the Medical and Dental College named after Professor Ruzuddinov and the Almaty Kazakh-Turkish Humanitarian Technical College. Kanafin Damir, Pilipenko Maxim, and Riskilya Yani successfully passed the competition and joined the ranks of students of the Almaty Polygraphic College, the Innovative Technical College, and the Eurasian Technological College.

College is the first step towards independence, socialization, and awareness of one's capabilities. Fellows of the Foundation are distinguished by their love of life, high motivation to study and the desire to keep up with their peers. They try to participate in the activities of their colleges and the Foundation, develop their soft skills and find time for interesting leisure.

Following the traditions of continuity, the Foundation's graduates, members of the Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation's Fellows Club, are trying to participate in the life of the Foundation, but in a new quality. Since 2013, they have been

making charitable donations to the special account of graduates, the raised funds are spent for additional educational grants. The first grant of the Alumni Club was awarded to Amirtay Dariya, now a graduate of the Foundation and AlmaU in 2018. A significant event of the past year was the establishment of another grant from the Alumni Club. Representatives of the Club were part of the jury and opted for the graduate of the special correctional school named after Ostrovsky in Almaty, Allayarova Aykorkem. Now Aykorkem is studying at the MAB College and is replenishing his piggy bank of achievements by participating in the College's events.

Kentau Program

The third, but no less significant project of the Foundation is the Yerzhan Tatishev Fellowship Program. This project was created in support of the school-lyceum No. 16 of Kentau, Turkestan region, where Yerzhan Nureldayemovich Tatishev studied. At the beginning of each academic year, the Foundation holds a competition of social projects among students of 8, 9, 10 and 11 parallels and the best of them are encouraged by scholarships for one academic year. Winners are determined in accordance with criteria such as academic performance, prizes in Olympiads and contests, achievements in other creative activities conducive to development, and, most importantly, willingness to make a qualitative change for your school. Performing their projects, the guys learn useful skills: they study time management, planning and delegation of authority, pump over negotiation and communication skills and work on the result. Over the entire existence of the program has been allocated 100 scholarships.

In 2019, the winners were: Abdi Mariam (8th "B" grade), Abdurashitov Davlat (9th "G" grade), Nasyrova Almira (9th "B" grade), Choi Alexander (8th "A" grade), Shamshieva Salima (8 "B" grade), Ermetov Ruslan (9 "A" grade), Kaldybekova Jasmin (9 "A" grade), Tolstopyatova Maria (11 "A"). The children were puzzled by the urgent problems of their school: faulty desks, lack of an oven in the technology room, a closet for clothes in the men's locker room, equipment for physical education lessons, lack of supporting material for preparing for the Olympics, but there are more multi-tasking projects like organizing the sorting of plastic trash for subsequent disposal and increased motivation for learning of primary school students. Despite the lack of experience with projects, the guys use all the resources to realize their idea.

Every year on April 22 at Kentau School No. 16, Memorial Day is held for Yerzhan Tatishev, dedicated to his birthday. On this day, are held in-school competitions in volleyball, military sports all-around, shooting sports, chess, intellectual games and creative competitions for the best drawing or crafts. The Foundation helps to improve the material and technical base of the school: this year the school was presented with amplifiers, microphones for creative circles at the school, blinds for the assembly hall and a multimedia projector.

On May 28, 2019, the presentation of business projects of 11 AlmaU students studying in the specialty "Management" and "Marketing" with an additional trajectory in "entrepreneurship" was held, 6 of them were scholarship holders of the 2018 BesTirek Program. The basis was the presentation format of Rocket Pitch, which is held annually at Babson College. For nine months, the guys worked on their development and submitted it to the jury. The jury consisted of: Chairman of the Board of Directors of the KUSTO Group and Chairman of Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation's Board of Trustees, Yerkin Tatishev; President of the Foundation, Dana Zharikova, Director of High Tech Academy,

Tatyana Basso, Vice-Rector for Corporate Communications of AlmaU, Madina Karsakbaeva, Director of the Center for Public Relations, Ksenia Yuzhaninova-Karadenizli. The guys had to tell why the product is necessary for the client, what is its uniqueness, how is the cost calculated and how many resources are required to launch it. The presented projects were related to clothing design, a tool rental service, drug delivery, a platform for vocational guidance for schoolchildren and professional training for students.

The best project was recognized as a fashion startup Two.Dots.Shop, the creation of the author's Kazakh ornament on t-shirts and accessories. The project is a modern interpretation of the Kazakh ornament, and it



will also appeal to those who want to be eco-friendly. The creator of the project, Kuanova Saltanat, received the

main prize - a trip to Babson College (USA), to the best educational institution in the world for entrepreneurship education, and from July 15 to 20 she completed an internship at Babson Build UG2 Summer 2019. Saltanat was among highly motivated students from Brazil, Colombia, Guatemala, Peru, Sweden, India, Saudi Arabia, Mexico, and South Korea have gained invaluable experience and knowledge that she will certainly apply to develop her startup.



Fellows of the 2017 BesTirek Program and third-year students of AlmaU, Kazakhstanova Zhanyl and Kenes Ayazhan visited Lynnan University, Hong Kong as part of the Service Learning University program. The two-week program included robotics grades, designing toys for children with disabilities, eco-projects, alternative energy challenges, a visit to the International Committee of the Red Cross, simulation games for a better understanding of people with



physical disabilities and many other activities aimed at on the development of humanitarian skills of students. The Pacific Ocean, the Taimoshan Mountains, subtropical plants, eight thousand skyscrapers - all converged on one boiling crossroads of Asia, which is not subordinated to either China or Great Britain. Hong Kong was struck by the great variety of cuisine, vegetation, unusually humid climate, and most importantly, social contrast.

A scholarship holder for the 2016 Financial and Economic Specialties Foundation Program and fourth-year student at KIMEP University, Tuyak Madina spent the summer in Williamsburg, Virginia (USA) under the Work and Travel Program. Madina worked in the McDonalds restaurant and the Maurizio's Italian restaurant and warmly recalls her colleagues, university students from Thailand, Malaysia, China, the USA, and other European countries. She was especially surprised that in America they pay great attention to working with a client. Despite the fact that I had to work 13-14 hours, to manage to see beautiful places and be ready for every new challenge - this is one of the best memories in her life. Full independence helps to gain invaluable life experience, which is possible only by breaking away from home.





Balabek Marzhan, a BesTirek scholarship holder and third-year student of AlmaU also held a Work and Travel Program contest. This was not the first trip to the USA, because Marjan is a graduate of the FLEX Program. Although cultural shock passed her side, the individualism of Americans will always be cause for surprise. Marjan notes that she gained extensive experience at the University of Alabama, visited the University of Florida and Flagler. The trip was incredible - with adventures, difficulties and happy moments.
