

FOUNDATION'S PROGRAMS

The Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation is a charitable organization that was registered in 2005. After the tragic situation - the untimely death of the recognized Kazakh financier who headed the Bank TuranAlem, Yerzhan Nureldaimovich Tatishev - a memorial fund was opened, whose mission was to support the development of the country through assistance to those in need. The initiative to create the Foundation belongs to the Tatishev family, who wanted to perpetuate the name of Yerzhan in this way. In the early years, the Foundation's activities were carried out within the framework of one-time humanitarian actions and diverse projects, which were characterized by some spontaneity. In a short time, the need for institutionalization and the choice of its field of activity became obvious. Having studied the needs of target groups, in 2007 the Foundation established projects such as the handicraft support program, the small grants program for NGOs, the professional development program for banking professionals, educational grants and scholarships programs. Subsequently, some of these programs lost relevance because of various reasons: some programs duplicated the activities of other NGOs, some were resource-intensive with low efficiency. The Foundation focused on supporting the education and development of talented youth of Kazakhstan, which subsequently became its core activity and is the core direction in which the Foundation is increasing its experience everyday.

Today, the Foundation implements three main programs: the BesTirek Program, the Program "Get a Craft!" and the Program to Support the initiatives of the Lyceum School No. 16, Kentau. Support of talented young people in their professional development, acquisition of useful skills that contribute to their personal growth and education of social responsibility is their main component.

Despite the global trend when success is determined by knowledge coupled with developed flexible skills, rather than having a diploma, for many Kazakh people a diploma is still an end in itself – "the main thing is to get a paper, and then we'll see." During the educational grant competition, the Foundation tries to build a selection process and subsequently interacts with the scholars in such a way as to exclude seekers of grant support only and ensure that "their" clients get into the programs as accurately as possible. Although, all other things being equal, the Foundation, as a rule, should give preference to the contestant with the least financial capabilities, nevertheless, the socio-economic situation of the applicants' family is a secondary selection criterion. First of all, the Foundation analyzes the identity of the applicant personality: a motivational essay, recommendations, self-presentation are carefully studied in order to understand his true motives and goals. Portrait of today's scholarship holder: he is a proactive and ambitious person with a high level of motivation and a developed EQ. Grantees not only receive an up-to-date education, but also learn social responsibility, develop their flexible skills, and acquire useful connections.















THE FOUNDATION EFFICIENCY STUDY

"Investing should be like watching paint dry or grass grow" (Paul Samuelson, Nobel Laureate in Economic Sciences). Investing in education is a time-consuming and resource-intensive process, and it is possible to evaluate the effectiveness of investments after a long period of time. Ten years have passed since the graduation of the first graduates — a sufficient period for the first "measurement", therefore, the Foundation conducted a study on the effectiveness of the educational programs of the Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation for the period from 2007 to 2020, from the period of the launch of programs to the current moment. The study was conducted by Zahira Begalieva and Nurzhamal Iminova, experts of "I Teach: Competence Development Center" in the field of monitoring and evaluation of programs/projects in the public sector.

The study involved 392 respondents from among the direct and indirect beneficiaries of the programs and 250 representatives of the general public representing various social groups of the population participated in the field part, using tools such as a blitz survey, field and desk methods. Such parameters as recognition, the image of the Foundation among the public and beneficiaries, the media presence of the Foundation, the disbursement of allocated funds, the amount of return on social investments, as well as geographical representation, academic performance, volunteer activities of the fellows, their distribution among universities and the involvement of graduates in the life of the Foundation were studied. The objective quantitative indicator was the change in the welfare of graduates, and the qualitative indicator was the improvement of their quality of life.

According to the results of the study, the amount of social investments per scholarship holder per year averages almost 4 million tenge (3,949,904 tenge). 84% of graduates are employed, 16% are still studying (for a master's degree, etc.). Graduates and their relatives note a high demand in the labor market for financial and economic professions. The size of the return on social investment ROI was 1.3. The resulting value exceeds 1. Thus, for each invested tenge there is a return of the invested funds with a small surplus.

According to the results of the study, valuable recommendations for the Foundation were the use of artificial intelligence in the selection of candidates, ensuring uniform geographical representation of fellows, expanding the activities of the Foundation through new "products", improving the work of the Board of Trustees, strengthening communication with graduates and increasing the recognition of the Foundation.






"BESTIREK" PROGRAM

The BesTirek program is a relatively new program of the Foundation, which had no analogues in the Kazakh space at the time of its launch. The program started in 2017 and is still undergoing changes and receiving new components. Its exclusivity is at the basis of, first of all, in its focus on teaching entrepreneurship, and secondly, in the approach itself, the so-called PBL (practice based learning) - learning in practice. PBL has been successfully used for a long time in developed countries, where 70% of the educational process is based on solving practical problems of real companies. Switching the focus of attention from classical education to entrepreneurship is a conscious step and is part of the Foundation's new strategy – nurturing young entrepreneurs who will become an active part of the Kazakh business community in the future. The implementation of this ambitious idea, of course, required the restructuring of the existing bachelor's degree program with its subsequent rebranding into BesTirek. The name of the Program contains the very five pillars that form its basis: the personality and potential of the scholarship holder himself, grant support from the Foundation, education received at the university, support from mentors and knowledge obtained as part of an internal grant for a summer internship at Babson College, Boston, USA.

The competition for grants of the BesTirek Program is held annually, graduates of schools and colleges of Kazakhstan with leadership qualities and linking their professional future with entrepreneurial activity are invited to participate. In the process of selecting fellows, the main attention is paid to the ability to think outside the box and act in changing conditions, stress - resistant, creativity in solving problems, as well as communication skills.

The Foundation's partner, Almaty Management University, expressed readiness to participate in the development and implementation of the updated program. Thus, the main specialties "marketing" or "management" were supplemented with the module "entrepreneurship", and in 2020 the University opened a new specialty for the tasks of the Program, BAE, "business administration in the field of entrepreneurship". The Almaty School of Entrepreneurship Development, especially for BAE students, including BesTirek Program's scholarship holders, regularly holds events that expand horizons and allow you to study the best practices. The scholarship holders attend business breakfasts with wellknown entrepreneurs, participate in hackathons, business incubators, and competitions for the best startup. In addition, an annual competition is already being held among the Foundation's scholarship holders to receive a grant for a trip to a summer camp at Babson College (Boston, USA). The College has been repeatedly recognized as the best educational institution successfully implementing PBL in the field of entrepreneurship. An internal competition is held among firstyear BAOP students, the best students get the opportunity to

gain valuable experience in the USA. Unfortunately, due to the coronavirus pandemic, the competition has been suspended since 2020. To fill this gap, the Foundation, together with Almaty, organized a summer internship at one of the largest mining enterprises in Kazakhstan - Kostanay Minerals JSC (Zhitikara, Kostanay region). The internship was aimed at placing the scholarship holders in the working conditions of a real enterprise and involving them in solving cases. In addition, a related task was to create conditions for establishing horizontal ties between scholarship holders of different "generations". For two months, the scholarship holders interacted with different departments and, in addition to solving cases, helped the company improve its Instagram account, developed merch and launched a chatbot. The negative aspect of the internship is that it was planned for the summer holidays and forced the guys to change their personal plans.

This year, 5 people from the first set of the BesTirek Program received diplomas: Balabek Marzhan (Taraz), Daulet-Lazy Muhammad (Shymkent), Kazakhstana Zhanyl (Astana), Kenes Ayazhan (Aktobe), Toleubaev Almas (Karaganda). The 2021 competition received 258 online applications of candidates from different regions of Kazakhstan. All stages of selection due to quarantine restrictions were held online. At the first stage, the competition commission examined all the applications received, paying special attention to the motivational essay, letters of recommendation, academic performance, awards received at subject Olympiads, sports competitions and other significant competitions. Also at this stage, documents describing the financial situation of each candidate were studied.

Out of the total number of contestants, 23 were invited to pass the 2nd stage of the competition, which took place in the form of a business game in which they had to demonstrate the declared qualities and skills. Five children became finalists in 2021: Kamilla Beksultanova (Almaty), Ziyafiddin Dariga (Petropavlovsk), Amina Isanova (Almaty), Amina Kulzhebayeva (Zhambyl village, Almaty region), Olzhas Kustanov (Aktobe).¹

"GET METIER!" PROGRAM

The program "Get metier!" was launched in 2008 in support of young people with disabilities. Every year, in parallel with the BesTirek Program, a competition for grants under this program is held. In addition to the target group, the Program has a number of differences, such as the freedom to choose a specialty and the possibility of obtaining a secondary technical education in any college in Kazakhstan. Graduates who have received basic secondary or general secondary education in ordinary or specialized schools are invited to the competition. It is worth noting that children with physical disabilities who have not been diagnosed with mental retardation can apply for the grant. Candidates for the grant must pass a competition consisting of three stages: submission of an online application, an interview and an assessment of the financial situation of the family. Of all the stages of the competition, the second one can be designated the key one, since it is the interview that makes it possible to evaluate the candidate in terms of his personal qualities. Particular attention is paid, first of all, to the motivation to get a profession and, in general, the desire for development, sociability, independence of judgment, the ability to make independent decisions and the presence of "character" in a good sense of the word. The close environment plays a huge role in the formation of a child's personality, and even more so for a child with special needs, therefore, during the interview, communication with the parents of the contestant is also conducted. The values of parents largely determine the child's self-esteem, his inner sense of fullness and self-confidence, his ability to soberly assess his capabilities without fixation on limitations. The fellows of the program "Get metier!" are distinguished by their love of life, openness and ability to cope with difficulties. Students bring a significant variety to their lives and introduce them to society, which always responds favorably to them.

In 2021, the Foundation honored the graduate of the Program, Aitmanbet Aktore, who graduated from the Economic College of Narkhoz University, and the ranks of the scholarship holders were replenished with three students, these are: Deneyev Meirambek (Turan College), Isayev Amir (Kazakh-Turkish Humanitarian and Technological College) and Smailov Dinmukhammed (College named after D. Konaev). All the children are from Almaty and graduated from boarding school No. 2 for children with musculoskeletal disorders. I would like to emphasize that the Alumni Club has allocated another grant and now Dinmukhammed's education is paid for by donations from the Foundation's graduates.



KENTAU PROGRAM

The third program of the Foundation is the Yerzhan Tatishev's Scholarship Program or the Program of nominal scholarships aimed at supporting students and the school itself -Lyceum No. 16 named after Yu.A. Gagarin, Kentau, Turkestan region, where Yerzhan Tatishev grew up and studied. The target audience of the Program is high school students of the Lyceum and is aimed at supporting their initiatives. During the entire existence of the Program, 109 scholarships have been awarded. The program has been in effect since 2007, until 2013, the scholarship was established for excellent students. In 2013, it was decided to change the approach to the implementation of the Program, and since then the Program has supported small social projects. Students of grades 8,9,10,11 can present their vision of how to make the life of the classroom and school interesting and rich. The contestants present their ideas at the beginning of each academic year after the announcement of the start of the competition. In addition to relevance, originality and feasibility, the criteria for participation in the competition are also: academic performance for the last academic year is not lower than 4.0 points, achievements in subject Olympiads, sports and creative competitions are also welcome. The advantage is enjoyed by projects that do not require expenses, have a long-term effect and contribute to the development of useful skills of children. In the process of implementing projects, the guys secretly develop their flexible skills: they learn to organize people, work in a team, effectively manage their time and

work for results. As well as last year, the selection of 2021 was held in an online format through the zoom platform. The Foundation established and allocated 6 scholarships, the winners were: Dombrovskaya Margarita with the project "Instagram page of the school", Kakharova Sarvinoz with the project "Classes for the development of logic", Molyugin Viktor with the project "Japanese Garden", Nasyrova Faniya with the project "Beading Club", Oralkyzy Sabina with the project "Book Club", Shoibekova Anel with the project "Creating video content to promote the school in social networks". Unfortunately, the author of the project to improve the foyer of the school, Viktor Malyugin, could not launch the project for personal reasons and refused the scholarship approved for him. The rest have started to implement their ideas and have already shared the interim results.

In addition to the scholarship program, a Memorial Day is held at the school every year on April 22 for the birthday of Yerzhan Tatishev. On this day, intellectual, creative and sporting events are held, among which a mandatory one is a volleyball tournament, which, as a student, Yerzhan himself was was interested. In connection with the relaxation of quarantine measures, events dedicated to Memorial Day in 2021 were held offline: an intellectual quiz among middle-level students, craft and drawing contests among junior classes. This year, the volleyball tournament was held on an urban scale, 11 school teams took part in it. The winners of contests and competitions were awarded with cups, medals and sports equipment. The winning teams were awarded a volleyball net and balls. The organizers noted that while on distance learning, the children missed school, teachers and communication with each other and participated in the event with great pleasure.

"Hi! My name is Pavel Odintsov, I am 20 years old. I am a student of a specialized boarding school for children with musculoskeletal disorders No. 2 in Almaty. In 2018, I participated in the Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation competition and won an educational grant. Now I am finishing the fourth year of the Central Asian Technical and Economic College of Almaty, Faculty of "Radio Engineering". First of all, I would like to add that the transition from school to college was very calm for me, I have heard many times that for most graduates entrance exams sound like something unreal, but I treated the entrance exams as a normal test, no more. I knew that if I didn't enroll now, I would have a chance to enroll next year, and no one canceled other colleges.

So, I am a first-year student. First of all, these are new faces, acquaintances, during these years you emphasize something new for yourself, but this happens exactly until the moment you are sent to work practice. I worked at the cinema for more than a month, during which time I realized that I did not like to come at six o'clock in the morning and sit next to the equipment all day, often until late at night.

In the fourth year, we were given a list of course work titles to choose from. From the presented list, I liked a very interesting topic, "Script development, shooting and editing of an animated film". Since this was something new for me, the choice was obvious. At that time, I had not experience in creating something large-scale, so I used a couple of techniques that helped me finish the work on time. I was satisfied with my work. I got a couple of comments, but it helped me see my mistakes and made me stronger.

After successfully completing the course project, I finally realized what I want in this life and what I will do in the coming years. After college, I decided to enter the Zhurgenov Academy.

Despite the fact that the work in the specialty turned out to be not the way I imagined it, I still believe that I am studying for a reason and college has become a kind of stepping stone for moving forward. After graduating from college at the Narkhoz University, I asked questions about where and how to get a higher education. I wanted to do marketing, as I became interested in it long before admission, and started watching suitable programs. When I came across a booklet about the upcoming selection for a grant from the Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation for the specialty marketing and entrepreneurship, I had no doubt that this was my chance. I liked the goals of the foundation and their mission responded, I was delighted with the university, because ALMAU is famous for its marketing program, and I realized that I want to be an entrepreneur. Having made all my efforts and passed all the stages of selection, I became a scholarship holder. It is impossible to describe my feelings: the grant was the best thing that could have happened to me in my 18 years, because thanks to the financial support of the Foundation, I had the opportunity to get a high-quality higher education at one of the best university in the country.



I immediately liked the educational process and student life. In the classroom, I received a lot of new information thanks to a strong staff of teachers, many of whom are practitioners and candidates of sciences. We took neuromarketing, event marketing, branding and many other subjects that immersed me in my specialty more

and more. At the entrepreneurship program, we studied tools that will be useful to us in the future, and also worked on our personal projects within the framework of the grant. It all had a great overlap with each other: we had the opportunity to apply and consolidate our knowledge in practice. Learning was not a tedious process. There was always a lot of life at the university. We had business breakfasts with well-known entrepreneurs of the city, giving us the opportunity to listen to them and ask questions. The curriculum also included lectures from invited speakers who had experience launching startups. All this created for us, as students, a real picture of entrepreneurship. I joined student organizations at AlmaU: I was engaged in charity work and a student magazine. This experience led to the acquaintance with many students who later became their close friends and colleagues.

By the end of the third year of study, the scholarship holders and I went to the city of Zhitikara for a summer internship. We had to work in the company "Kostanay minerals", which is engaged in the extraction of asbestos. We divided into teams and worked on various projects: maintaining social networks, developing chatbots, creating an organization's merch, etc.

Based on my experience in graphic design, I took the development of a brand book. We worked and lived together with other scholarship holders of the foundation, which gave us all a lot of warm memories. We had the opportunity to communicate directly with the managers of such a large enterprise, who became our mentors. Impressions remained after excursions to the production, warehouses and asbestos deposit. I left there a different person, and it was an unforgettable experience I ever had. Looking back, I realize that my student years were eventful and truly rewarding, even despite the pandemic and online learning. I have highlighted the main points that I have noted during my 4 years of study at the university:

- Understand the purpose of your training. This gives the internal engine to continue gnawing the granite of knowledge, even despite the difficulties.
- ✓ Be proactive. Don't be afraid and don't be shy.
- ✓ Perform tasks responsibly
- ✓ Already as a student, strive to gain work experience (not to the detriment of academic duties), as well as look for internships during the holidays.
- ✓ Choose to work in a team.
- ✓ Be purposeful, fair and persistent.
- Engage in volunteer and charitable activities.
- ✓ Get to know other students. It's not only fun, but also useful. You can become friends, partners and colleagues for each other.

My future plans are to gain work experience as a marketer, as well as continue my education and get a master's degree. All this is necessary to start my own business, because now I realize how much I want to be an entrepreneur. The Foundation changed my life and directed it. He became my foundation and laid values, gave me experience, became a mentor, opened new doors. I am graduating from the university not only with two degrees, but also with inner values, core and new qualities that were brought up in me. Thanks to the Yerzhan Tatishev Foundation, I will confidently go through life and work tirelessly to be a worthy graduate and satisfy expectations.

"Thanks to the E.Tatishev Foundation, in 2018 I entered the Almaty Management University, a specialty that I dreamed. The Foundation helped me to fulfill my dream, to study on a grant in Almaty, without straining my family with financial difficulties. At the same time, I got an additional opportunity to study in the second minor "Entrepreneurship", where there were very cool and the best teachers who gave me a lot of knowledge and showed me opportunities for growth and development. The university gave me good friends, interesting acquaintances, gave me a sense of self-confidence. Of course, it was not only the university, the same feelings were given to me by the city of Almaty, where people are charged, positive, interesting. There is always something going on in this city: events, competitions, trainings, etc. I think that I have changed a lot internally in 4 years, thanks to the Foundation, the University, the city...

There were very cool teachers at major and minor, I won't get tired of repeating it, especially at minor. Since the Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation Development provided us with practitioners, those who have practical experience in the entrepreneurial environment. Also, according to the Entrepreneurship program, trainings, startup

competitions, business breakfasts with entrepreneurs were held for us. Business breakfasts are generally a separate story, we were very lucky that we had them before the pandemic and quarantine, since online meetings cannot be compared with offline ones, this is completely different. At offline breakfasts, where you can see a person live, ask him a question, get to know him personally. All our guys on the program loved these meetings very much, it was a pity there were only 5 of them then.

In addition to the fact that the scholarship holders should study well, our responsibilities include volunteering. For the first 2 years, I worked volunteer hours, thanks to 2 student organizations where I was a member: DOES - charity club, and Enactus. In these two organizations, I met good guys who became close friends to me. But there is no need to think that it is necessary to join these organizations, in addition to them, other student clubs hold charitable and useful events. And there are a lot of clubs in ALMA, after all, this is what my university are known for in Almaty - a busy student life. There are also many different volunteer organizations and events in the city where volunteers are required. There are not many difficulties with this.

I would also like to tell you about the first internship held at Kostanay Minerals. This internship was unexpected for us, but nevertheless, I think it was done well, as the first in the program. For us, students, it was a kind of challenge, where we showed ourselves well. I am happy with the internship, as the Foundation and the staff of Kostanay Minerals provided us with great conditions for the internship, we definitely did not expect this. I was happy because I found a new direction for myself to earn money after this internship. We worked on projects, my was called "HR chat bot". I was alone in the team, but I still did a good project, I studied the creation of a chatbot from scratch and launched it. I just like to understand different programs, creating something on computers, etc., so I chose such a project. If it wasn't for management, I would have gone in the IT direction.

Now I am freelancer,I have tried to work in the office and on a remote, I realized that a remote for me is a suitable format. I don't like being tied to one place and working on a schedule. I love freedom in any activity, but at the same time I am disciplined, so I don't have any special difficulties with this. I have experience in different areas, but mainly sales. I really like to try something new, learn new skills, programs, tasks, etc. And I realized all this for myself and revealed it in myself, thanks to these 4 years. Further, of course, more, until I know what I will come to, for me life is an adventure.

I would like to advise future scholarship holders and applicants to be more open, confident and curious. Look for knowledge everywhere, look for information everywhere, ask and do not hesitate. Do not be afraid, the university is like a playground where you can fall, make mistakes, the consequences are not so terrible, but you will roughly understand what will happen outside the walls of the university. The university provides opportunities, knowledge, but this does not mean that everyone will be outstanding. You need to reach out to them yourself and not stand still. I give these tips because I haven't always followed them myself. The Foundation provides good training conditions, but before agreeing to them, you should think about everything carefully, understand that you are taking responsibility and obligations to the Foundation and your family. Approach it more consciously. It is not difficult to study at the university if you really study and do everything as they say. And then everything depends on you.2

SCHOLARS' CLUB

The scholarship holders of BesTirek Program spend 192 hours each academic year on volunteer projects. Along with academic performance requirements, this is also a condition of the Program. Everyone chooses their own direction and target group and independently determines the intensity of volunteer work. Projects can be both one-time and long-term, large-scale or local level, own ideas or already existing initiatives of other organizations. The main condition for choosing a particular project is its relevance in terms of benefits for the target audience.


The Foundation's scholarship holders are almost always part of the proactive part of the student youth. Most of them are members of student clubs and participate in volunteer movements. Participation in the social life of the community, of course, helps them to build up competencies and master relevant knowledge, but, most importantly, develops their flexible skills, teaches them to work in a team, instills responsibility for their actions, trains their emotional endurance. All these factors shape their moral qualities and help them grow into harmonious people. Graduates admit that as students they perceived volunteering as a mandatory work-out and just a condition for maintaining the grant, but in adulthood they realized the value of gratuitous assistance to those who were less fortunate and recognize the benefits of volunteer work.


